Seattle MINI Landed!

Seattle MINI opened in September of this year as an entirely new and different kind of car dealership. It's a flagship store for the MINI brand. The idea was to make the dealership a destination - a place to hang out, to grab a coffee drink, use the free Wi-Fi, maybe even have a quick meeting with a client if it's convenient.

Rather than designating specific areas to sell merchandise or display new models, these areas are intermingled throughout the store. New MINI dealerships will follow this model with a more relaxed, clubhouse type atmosphere - almost like a coffee shop that also happens to sell your favorite car.

General Sales Manager Richard Stone explained that Seattle MINI opened because there's been enough demand at Northwest MINI to justify another location, even with the downturn in the economy. Buyers continue to see the MINI as a "value car," meaning that you get a lot for your money, including better than average resale value. Seattle MINI has drawn in a new group of customers from the immediate Seattle area, and hasn't taken much business from Northwest MINI. The Lake City Way location was chosen for its proximity to downtown, I-5 and I-405. In its first month of operation, Seattle MINI has sold 45 new MINIs, with orders placed for another 20. To deal with Seattle's inclement weather, Seattle MINI

boasts a unique feature - an underground display area with bright lighting and tons of MINIs to see and drive.

There are 16 service bays in the impeccably



clean and quiet service area, which features a large picture window - one mechanic's favorite feature of the new building. Service Manager Kyle Canalizo, Parts Manager Wade Olson and two Motoring Advisers have made the move from Northwest MINI. Whether you're stopping by for a latte, buying parts, or maybe even a new car, Seattle MINI is here and open for you. Nothing exemplifies this more that the fact that they are hosting the PSMINI holiday party this year.
